Call to Order and Attendance: President Brad Geldert called the meeting to order at 8:15 p.m.

Reading of the Minutes:

• The minutes of the May 2011 meeting were read and unanimously approved.

Treasurer's report:

• The financial report was not available for review.

Chronicle Editor's report (Mailings in March, May, June, July, August, and October):

• July 20th is the deadline to submit information for the next newsletter. The swim team will submit a season wrap up and the pool manager will submit end of the season information.

Rental Report:

• None presented.

Pool Manager's report:

- Evaluations have just been written and management is in the process of issuing them to the staff.
- One lifeguard had a conflicting schedule with summer school and was not utilized all season.
- End of year staffing should be good. Hours will be 4 p.m. until 7 p.m. after school starts.
- Brad suggested we encourage some of our gate guards who will be eligible to be lifeguards next year to seek certification during the off-season.

- Umbrellas were purchased.
- Swim Lessons: Enrollment was slow in the beginning but classes are pretty full now. The last session is looking like it will fill up.
- Concession sales have been good. We are using COSTCO delivery now.
- Pool party bookings are well booked from now through the end of the season.

Swim Team Report:

• Lucas Cunha, the Swim Team Coach, appeared at the Board Meeting to discuss issues the happened during the Swim Team season. He expressed a desire to continue coaching the team next year, and acknowledged this year was a growing year for the team.

Facility Report:

• We are still waiting for the battery for the handicap lift.

Old business:

• Brad told West Coast Aquatics we have some issues with our pool heaters that may prevent us from leasing the facility to them. West Coast Aquatics is going to have a maintenance person come to the Cabana Club to assess our issues to see if they can be solved.

New business:

- Issues by several Swim Team families who were present at the Board meeting were discussed regarding the management of the Swim Team this year. The overall complaint was the lack of a formal way to complain about decisions made by Parent Reps or a place to take concerns when there are potential conflicts of interests between the complaining families and Parent Reps. When the Swim Team was brought back under the Board of Directors, The Board had believed the Swim Team had a formal management structure that included bylaws related to the running of the Swim Team. The Board would like the Swim Team to maintain its autonomy when dealing with Swim Team issues; however the Board also understands its responsibility to its membership to maintain order in its subcommittees.
- A motion was made to form a committee to formulate bylaws that will direct the management of the swim team. The bylaws will be subject to approval of the Board of Directors. The bylaws shall at a minimum direct the formation and management of the swim team, which shall report to the Board of Directors as a subcommittee, and it will manage all Swim Team issues. The motion passed unanimously by all Board members.
- Grace Soto offered to put the subcommittee together, which will utilize former Swim Team Parent Reps. Sally Duffy, Vice President of the Board agreed to be a member of the committee.
- The current management of the Swim Team shall continue until new bylaws are drafted and approved.

- The Nichols lodged a complaint against the Swim Team Parent Reps and their management of the Swim Team. The Board of Directors read the Nichol's family complaints. The Board of Directors will send the complaints to the Swim Team Parent Reps for a reply of the Nichol's family complaint. The Parent Reps are to reply directly to the Board of Directors by the September Board Meeting.
- A discussion occurred regarding the removal of the Swim Team trophy case that was noted in the March 2012 minutes. A petition supporting the display of the Swim Team plaques and trophies was presented to the Board of Directors, which was signed by over 100 members of the Association. The Board pointed out that when the display cases were removed the motion included having the Swim Team display its plagues and photos on the walls of the Cabana clubhouse. Swim Team representatives were at that Board meeting, and they understood they were allowed to put up the plagues and photos on the walls of the clubhouse in lieu of the trophy cases. Several parents present pointed out this information was not expressed to them when the issue was brought to their attention. Grace Soto and Joe Schaefer expressed that they would have appreciated having this information given to them as members of the Swim Team prior to the issue being voted on by the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors agreed that we are committed to displaying the history of our Swim Team. It was agreed that time would be allowed for the development of the formal Swim Team by laws prior to determining the specific method for displaying the Swim Team memorabilia at the Cabana Club.

Adjournment:

The meeting was adjourned at 10:05 p.m.

Summer Olympics 2012 Recap



- New Zealand had its most successful summer games since 1988 winning 13 medals
- The US won the overall medal count in track & field taking home 29 medals, 9 of which were gold
- The US came out on top of the medal count in swimming for both the men and women with 16 and 15 medals respectively followed by Japan for the men with 6 and Australia for the women with 7
- . A total of 383 medals were awarded after 17 days and 302 events
 - The US got the most medals with 104 followed by China with 88
 - The US got the most gold and silver medals with 46 and 29 respectively and Russia got the most bronze medals with 32
 - The hosting nation Great Britain Came in 4th in the medal Count with 65 medals
 - The next summer Olympics will take place in Rio de Janeiro in 2016
